



QUALITY AND SAFETY

The quality and safety of care is our priority, and quality is a key feature of our corporate culture.

Measurement metrics differ from country to country, but are continuously integrated into work processes throughout the group.

IN FRANCE

Our Group has received the highest certification marks from the French National Authority for Health (HAS) for a general hospital provider.


99% A + B certification for our facilities VS 93% nationally.

This procedure, which is independent of the facility and its supervisory bodies, covers:

- → The level of services and care provided to patients.
- → The dynamics of improving the quality and safety of care.

In addition to HAS certification, regular internal audits are performed using Qualiscope.





QUALITY AND SAFETY SWEDEN, NORWAY AND DENMARK

In our Nordic facilities, quality measurement is based on QPIs (Quality Performance Indicators) which assess the performance of each facility in four areas:



Modern medicine



Correct information



Appropriate treatment



A pleasant environment and suitable equipment

They allow medical results and patient satisfaction to be assessed.

These QPIs are shared by all the medical and care staff and are provided at all levels of the treatment pathway. This makes it easier to compare facilities and share best practice.



In addition to these QPIs, facilities have national indicators at their disposal. In Sweden, there are more than 100 national quality registries. Each registry provides information, by disease or treatment, on the issues that must be addressed.



HOSPITALS AND SPECIALIST CLINICS

In Sweden, Norway and Denmark:



Healthcare is moving towards greater specialisation and sub-specialisation. Our facilities support this progress by:

- → constantly improving the quality of our medical care,
- → continuously developing the expertise of doctors, nurses and all staff,
- → creating units with a high level of expertise.

Sharing best practices and implementing new modern treatment methods has considerably reduced the average length of admission over the last five years.

IMAGING

Imaging is essential for diagnosing several pathologies. It is very often available at our facilities, which boast an equipment inventory consisting of:

- · 36 MRI machines
- · 30 CT scanners
- · 6 PET scanners
- · 15 gamma cameras
- 27 interventional radiology rooms for guiding minimally invasive medical procedures under optimal precision and safety conditions
- 11 hybrid rooms (combination of an interventional room and an operating theatre)

EMERGENCY DEPARTMENTS



45 emergency departments in our MSO facilities



+ 900,000 emergency department consultations /year

To complement this emergency care provision and meet the needs of the population, while combating medical deserts, Ramsay Santé has opened 8 unscheduled care facilities, renamed "SOS Soins urgents", in France.

Located within our facilities, they provide walk-in consultations with specialist doctors.

They benefit from the proximity of technical facilities (radiology, ultrasound, etc.). and examinations, allowing them to provide complementary care and to relieve the emergency departments.



Efficient organisation: the new emergency department at Hôpital privé de l'Ouest Parisien (Trappes, France)

→ In France, Ramsay Santé displays online, real-time waiting times and throughput times for its emergency departments, on their websites and the mobile app.

→ Less than 30 minutes:

The average waiting time between admission and the start of treatment in our emergency departments for 85% of patients.



In Sweden, our group manages the only private hospital with an emergency department: St Göran in Stockholm.

MATERNITY WARDS

OUTPATIENT SURGERY AND ENHANCED RECOVERY AFTER SURGERY (ERAS)

Ramsay Santé is the undisputed leader in outpatient surgery (same-day admission and discharge for patients), which accounts for 68% of the procedures performed.

Outpatient surgery is growing due to the development of minimally invasive operating techniques and adapted anaesthesia techniques. ERAS aims to enable patients to recover their functional capacity more quickly after a procedure.

Originally reserved for simple procedures, outpatient surgery today involves complex surgical operations: (total) hip and knee prosthesis, prostatectomy, colectomy, herniated disc, etc.

We are adapting our organisations and structures to coordinate these treatments, to improve the well-being of our patients. Our facilities are increasingly designed specifically around outpatient surgery:


We have made the fight against cancer a priority, particularly by certifying 12 oncology institutes (including 7 general, 4 specialising in breast cancer and breast/prostate cancer). As genuine centres of excellence in their health field, they offer patients comprehensive and tailored care in the shortest possible time, thanks to the medical and paramedical expertise coordinated on site.



Ramsay Santé has created the job of nurse coordinator within each oncology institute.



Oncogenetic consultations provide early screening and offer tailored follow-up for people at risk of developing cancer.



Molecular biology: faster access to genomic analysis of tumours, enabling truly personalised treatments to be prescribed.


Our chronic kidney disease patients receive a truly coordinated treatment pathway.

INNOVATION

In October 2019, Ramsay Santé launched the Espace Médical Nutrition Obésité in Dijon (21 - France), which specialises in treating excess weight, obesity and eating disorders. EMNO allows patients to access the skills of a multidisciplinary team (doctor, nurse, dietician, psychologist, etc.) and a comprehensive care programme without the disruption of hospital admission.

FCR - FOLLOW-UP CARE AND REHABILITATION

Some surgical procedures require postoperative care in a specialist follow-up care and rehabilitation (FCR) facility: medical care, rehabilitation, reintegration.

These facilities are aiming to specialise more and more (cardiology, oncology, nutrition, etc.), to provide support and a care programme adapted to pathologies.

MENTAL HEALTH

Ramsay Santé offers a range of prevention and care services adapted to various mental and addiction pathologies, from screening to treatment to cognitive and social rehabilitation.

Our group works in close collaboration with psychiatric emergency services, public structures, associations as well as all those working in the field of mental health and addictions

Development of increasingly tailored care, with various care models:


- → possibility of **full hospital admission or an alternative** (day or night hospital, as well as a home hospitalisation unit)
- → creation of structures or units dedicated to specific populations: adolescents, young adults, health professionals or elderly people
- → complementarity between the public sector and community medicine with postemergency, crisis and even nonconsensual admission units

Our sector also includes 5 follow-up care facilities specialising in addiction and 1 facility specialising in disability.

MENTAL HEALTH

Our practices give pride of place to therapeutic innovations and new treatment methods:

- → r-TMS or Repetitive Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation, used, in particular, to treat depression, addictions or OCD
- → VRT, a therapy which uses Virtual Reality, for example to treat phobias
- → **light therapy**, available to patients to treat depression, but also to teams and caregivers.

We aim to, and have the possibility of, supporting each patient throughout his or her life.



PROXIMITY CARE CENTRES HEALTH CENTRES



Already common in Sweden and Norway, these proximity care centres address the population's problems accessing healthcare.



The patient registers with the centre of his or her choice. Consultations can take place:

- → directly in the centre, where the patient is treated by a multidisciplinary team and oriented after the evaluation of symptoms
- → via a digital (chat) tool that puts the patient in direct contact with a carer.

The centre chosen by the patient receives an annual flat-rate fee, whether or not the patient had a consultation. The amount varies according to age, medical condition and social criteria (principle of capitation funding). The patient can choose to change centre at any time if he or she is not satisfied.



Ringen (Stockholm, Sweden)

- → One of the group's largest proximity care centres
- → 27,000 registered patients 100 doctors and carers
- → A comprehensive range of care as well as home care and complementary specialities: ENT and child and adolescent mental health
- → Digitalisation: as with all the centres, access to the chat tool is available in Ringen. 23,500 "visits" in 2019, 75% of which were handled by a nurse.





In France

- → In 2020-2021, Ramsay Santé is expected to open 4 centres based on the "proximity care centre" model with capitation funding. The regions involved are: Ile-de-France and Auvergne Rhône-Alpes.
- → This project is in line with Article 51 of the Social Security Financing Act. It allows experimentation with new health organisations based on new funding methods, "as long as these new organisations contribute to improving patient care, the efficiency of the health system, access to care or the relevance of prescribing health products. »

Teleconsultation

Thanks to the Capio Flow app, the patient has direct access to his or her proximity care centre and remote consultations with professionals (doctors, midwives, psychologists) via telephone/chat. The chat tool can be used instead of, or in preparation for, a physical appointment.

This is currently only available in the Nordic countries.



Telemedicine

Developing the use of telemedicine for better access to care and equal opportunities.

The initial specialities involved: stroke management and skin cancer detection.



INNOVATION HUB

The Innovation Hub is the future of healthcare. It aims to make the Ramsay Santé group a pioneer in Health 2.0. and enables patients to access a new generation of personalised care, notably through the use of data, whether via remote or face-to-face consultations.
