He began his career in strategy consulting before joining the insurance sector in 1991 within the UAP Group (now AXA France) where he was responsible for several operational departments before being appointed Deputy Managing Director of Axa France Services in 2000 and then Director of Central Functions for Axa France. In 2002, he was appointed Chairman and CEO of Barclays Banking Group for France and then Chairman and CEO of Barclays Spain in 2010. He joined Ramsay Générale de Santé on 30 June 2011 as Chief Executive Officer.
